

## **CAMP T.N. SPENCER PARK CAMPING RULES**

**Please report any damages or missing items to the Park Ranger immediately upon check in. You must checkout with a Park Ranger and complete a walk thru of your area before departing.**

**Camping** is allowed in designated areas by permit only.

### **ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES AND TOBACCO PRODUCTS ARE PROHIBITED**

(Cabarrus County Ordinance Section 50-4 and 50-14)

**Reservations** are required and can be made by calling 704-920-3351 Monday thru Friday between the hours of 8 am and 5 pm or online at [www.cabarruscounty.us/reservepartner](http://www.cabarruscounty.us/reservepartner). Fourteen (14) days maximum continuous stay. Two night minimum weekend rental requires Friday and Saturday to be reserved.

**Registration:** adults (21 years of age or older) must register and occupy site. Children under 18 years of age must not be left alone and must have adult supervision at all times. Guests are required to check in and out with the Park Ranger.

**Parking:** after registering vehicles may be driven to site to unload and again to load when departing.(20 minute limit) At all other times vehicles must be parked in the paved parking areas.

**Park gates:** the park gates will be locked according to the posted park operating hours. An emergency phone and numbers are posted at the phone on the porch of the park office building. Emergency exit gate access to exit will be provided at check in.

**Emergencies:** contact the park ranger on duty during park hours or use the emergency phone at the office. Please report any accidents to the park ranger.

**Visitors/guests:** visitors or guests not staying overnight must leave the park before the gates are closed.

**Quiet time** is from 10:00 pm to 8:00 am. Please respect the rights of others by keeping music and talking at a low volume.

**Campfires** are permitted in fire rings only. **NO GROUND FIRES!** Fires must be attended by a responsible adult at all times. Extinguish completely before leaving campsite. Do not throw trash in fire rings, use proper receptacles. Fires must be of reasonable size and are not allowed during burning bans. **No cutting of Park trees permitted.**

**Damaging park property:** cutting of trees, defacing buildings, tables, and littering, etc. is a violation of park ordinances.

**Fishing:** all North Carolina Wildlife regulations apply. No fishing after dark. Park fishing permits are required.

**Hunting and/or trapping is not permitted.** All Cabarrus County Parks are wildlife and nature preserves.

**Swimming/Wading** is not permitted in any of the park's lakes or streams.

**Firearms:** no person shall possess, carry, use, or discharge any type of firearm, air gun, paintball gun, or any other weapon within the park except authorized law enforcement or wildlife officer.

**Fireworks** of any type are prohibited.

**Pets** must be restrained on a leash of six feet or less at all times. **Pets are not allowed inside the cabins or bath house at any time. Pets may not remain in the Park overnight. This is to included cabins, tent sites, vehicles, or kennels.**

**Check in time** is 3:00 pm. **Check out time** is 11:00 am. Please check in and out with the Park Ranger. Vehicles must be inside Park each day by closing times as listed below.

**Park hours**

March-October            8 am until 8 pm  
November-February    Mon. – Friday 8 am until 5 pm  
   Saturday & Sunday 9 am until 5 pm

**Enforcement:** failure to abide by the regulations and ordinances governing Cabarrus County Parks will subject offender to temporary or permanent expulsion from the park and/ or criminal prosecution. In the event of permit revocation, all monies paid shall be forfeited by the offender and retained by the park. All North Carolina Motor Vehicle and traffic laws apply in the Park.

**Camping fees**

**Tent sites**            Resident - \$15.00 per night  
                                 Maximum of 2 tents and 6 people

**Cabins**                \$50.00 per night  
                                 Maximum of 6 people

**Group**                \$30.00 per night                            \*Available only to youth organizations  
**Camping\***            9 sites, maximum of 30 people

## **TENT SITES**

Each of the tent sites includes a picnic table, grill, fire circle, and trash can. A restroom/shower building is centrally located and also includes an outside utility sink.

A maximum of two tents and 6 people is allowed at each tent site.

**No cutting or otherwise damaging of live or dead trees, shrubs, etc.**

Put all trash in trash and recycling in containers provided.

Fires should only be made in fire circles and watered down upon leaving.

Please adhere to check in and check out policy.

Be aware of gate closing times and emergency procedures.

Park only in designated paved parking areas.

Picnic tables are not allowed to be removed.

## **CABINS**

Each cabin includes one double bed, one set of bunk beds, a day bed, chest of drawers, dining table with chairs, small refrigerator, and microwave. Each cabin also has heat and air conditioning. No bed linens, pillows, or dishes are provided.

Furniture may not be removed from the cabins.

Please remove all trash and clean cabin before checking out.

Camping tents are not permitted on cabin sites. Dining canopies are allowed.

## **GROUP CAMPING**

Group camping site includes a fire pit, picnic table, grill, trash can, recycling can and (9) tent sites with a maximum of 35 people allowed.

To qualify to stay in the Group Camping area you need provide certification and documentation that you meet one of the following criteria: Boy Scouts of America, Girl Scouts of America, or other organized youth group.

Groups must provide documentation to meet criteria for Group Camping area use. Examples of qualifying documentation are as follows but not limited to: charters, letters of official letterhead from the group organizer, youth leader, or a 501 (c) 3 non-profit organization.
